- ► NCURA began in 1959 with 45 members and one Annual Meeting a year
- ➤ Today NCURA has approximately 7,000 individual members from over 2,200 colleges, universities, teaching hospitals, and non-profit research institutes in 40 countries
- ► Oldest and largest Research Administration organization globally

Undergraduate Students: 6,800


Graduate & professional students: 10,159

- Awarded first Horizon Europe Grant in Q4 of FY21: I3LUNG



FY22 Expenditure by Funding Source






Center in Paris

- Est. 2004 (expansion scheduled for completion 2023)
- Rue Thomas Mann (near the French National Library and the University of Paris VII)
- Hosts academic & public events, study abroad programs
- Supports UChicago & local researchers and students
- Faculty Director: Francois Richard, Associate Professor of Anthropology, Romance Languages and Literatures, and Social Sciences in the College



Funding international collaborations

- \$7.6 million in funding awarded through the Provost's Global Faculty Awards to support collaborative projects East Asia, Southeast Asia, France and Latin America
- Over 400 funded projects involving more than 500 faculty representing all schools and divisions
- Other opportunities include:
 - FACCTS (France)
 \$2.2 million in funding to 129 faculty
 - Yuen Research Funds
 (Hong Kong and GBA)
 \$700,000 in funding to 16 faculty



Challenges of International Research: Multi-directional

- 1. Regulatory
 - ✓ Conflicting regulatory requirements
 - ✓ Possible lack of local regulation
- Different levels of expertise in research administration and infrastructure i.e. sub-award monitoring
- 3. Difficulty to meet U.S. funder requirements
- 4. Cultural differences
- 5. Budget consideration
- 6. Communication Challenges
- 7. Tax issues
- 8. Other...

Challenges of International Research: The Start-up Costs


- 1. New Sponsor Types create administrative burden and compliance obligations
- 2. Negotiations can be complex and costly
- 3. Missions and Policy do not always align
 - ✓ Indemnification
 - ✓ Publication
 - ✓ Confidentiality
 - ✓ Privacy/Data
 - ✓ Intellectual Property
- 4. Convincing Leadership
- 5. Budget restrictions and IDC under recovery
- 6. Reporting and Invoicing concerns
 - ✓ Currency Loss or Gain

Challenges in Managing U.S. Funds


- FCOI training, disclosure
- Endless variety of subaward forms
- Constant monitoring of new regulations and implement changes (e.g. salary caps)
- Effort reporting
- Technical and financial Audits (programmatic audits)
- Cost transfer / budget shifting

- Allowable or non-allowable costs (e.g. alcohol)
- F&A costs
- Export Controls
- Training of staff (central, pre- and post award, institutional, scientific)
- Monitoring of Subawardees
- Main Awardee vs Coordinator

FY2021 U.S. Spending by Awarding Agency to International Organizations (Top 10)




Rewards of International Research


